STADIUM SEATS AVAILABLE

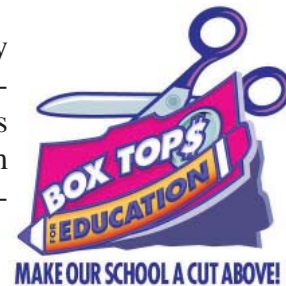

Please remember, all lunch orders MUST be placed by 9:00 am on the day BEFORE the lunch is to be eaten. For example, orders for Monday lunches are due on Friday by 9:00 am. Juice or milk is provided with lunch purchase. Orders can be placed with the homebase teacher, and soon you will be able order online. Thanks to Stella's for providing our lunches this year.

NOTES FROM THE NURSE

1. Reminder- Please turn in your Health Inventory and Medication forms to the office.
2. If your child has asthma, please consider keeping some medication in the Nurse's Office in case he/she needs it during the school day. If you would like for your child to be able to carry his/her own inhaler, you must complete the appropriate forms. These must be renewed each year. These forms are available in the Nurse's Office and must be on file before your child is allowed to carry and self-administer his/her own medication. This is in accordance with state and federal laws.
3. **Special Food may only be shared with a child other than your own after prior notice is provided to the faculty.** Prior notice will allow teachers to make known any student's allergies to certain foods or special dietary needs. **Please remember that we have several students with potentially life threatening food allergies.** You should notify your child's home base teacher for preschool thru 9th grades. If special food/treats will be provided during the lunch period, you must notify the teacher on lunch duty or Sheila prior to sharing the food items.
4. Note to clarify the medication policy- Medication will be given only according to the labeled instructions regarding age/weight and dosage. Note-many cough and cold medications are not recommended for children under 6 years of age. Herbal substances, vitamins or food supplements will not be administered by the school nurse or staff.
5. We will post important health related information on our website at www.allsaintsschool.org under the Health Services section. A copy of the medication authorization form is also located under this section.
6. Finally, a brief reminder for parents to bring/send a note from the parent or healthcare provider after your student has had a medical absence.

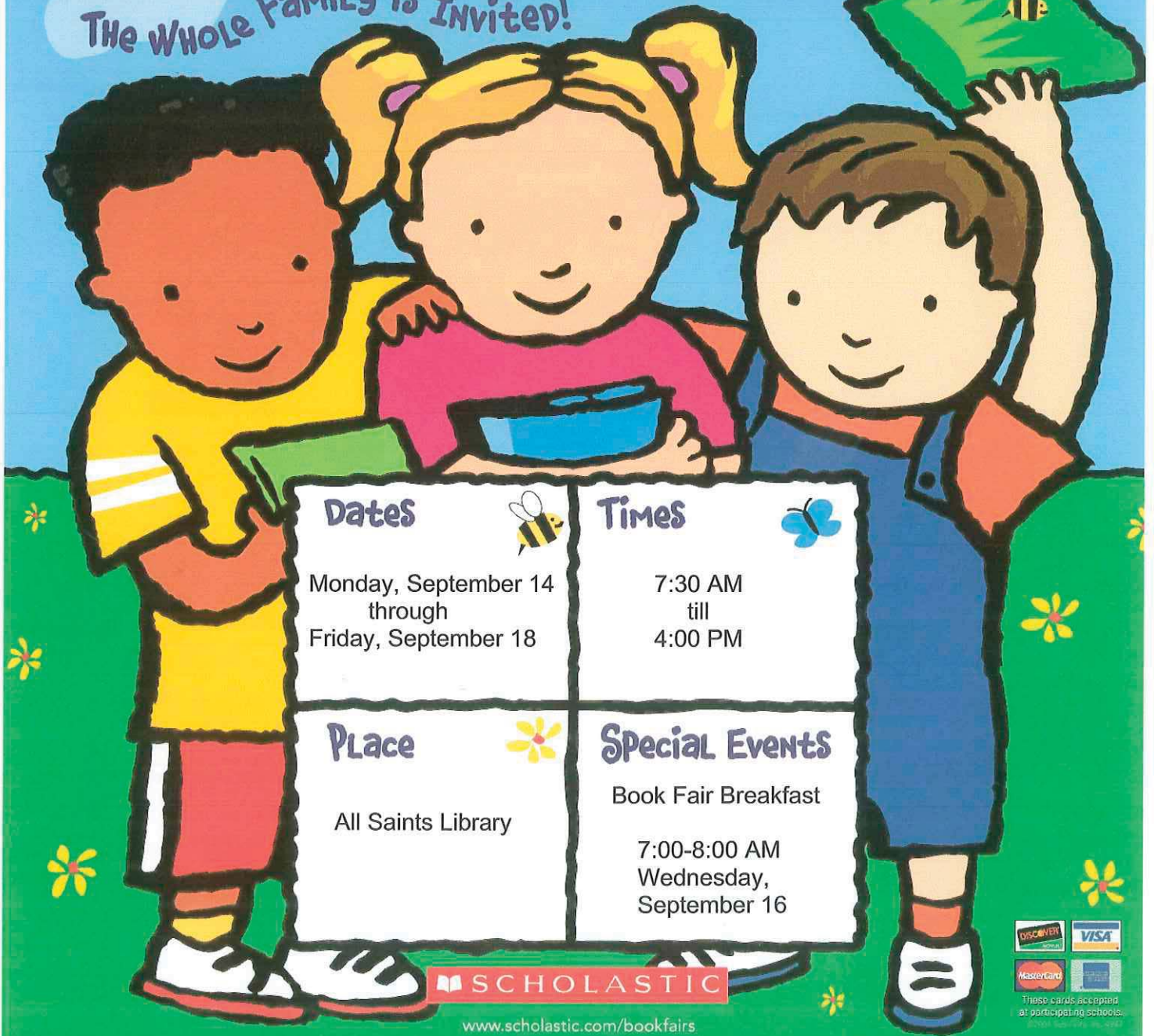
